Follow Up:

- No strenuous activity for 48 hours. Resume moderate activity in 48 hours. (No lifting items over 10 lbs., don't strain to go to bathroom, nothing that's going to raise your heart rate or blood pressure. These activities could increase bleeding.) No heavy exercising until you are seen for follow up in one week.
- > Take Tylenol as needed for discomfort.
- Leave the bandage in place until you come in for follow up in one week. If the bandage becomes blood tinged or loose, reinforce it with gauze and tape. (Refer to the reverse side of this page for management of bleeding)
- ➤ Keep the bandage dry. Wash around it carefully. (waterproof bandages or Press-N-Seal)
- Fig. 1. If the tape becomes soiled or starts to come off, reinforce it with additional paper tape.
- > Do not smoke for 3 weeks; smoking is detrimental to wound healing and may cause the graft to die.
- No alcoholic beverages for 48 hours.
- Avoid prolonged exposure to extremely cold temperatures for 3 weeks.
- It is normal to have swelling and bruising around the surgical site. The bruising will fade in approximately 10-14 days. Elevate the area to reduce swelling. (head, leg, arm x 2 nights)
- Numbness, itchiness and sensitivity to temperature changes can occur after surgery and may take up to 18 months to normalize.

#### Follow Up:

- 1. Leave bandage that is applied today on for 1 week.
- 2. Do **not** get this bandage wet for 1 week.
- 3. You will start 1 week from today doing daily bandage changes. At this time, you can begin wound care as follows:
  - 1. Clean area with tap water using a Q-tip or gauze pad. (shower / bathe normally)
  - 2. Dry wound with Q-tip or gauze pad.
  - 3. Apply Polysporin, Bacitracin Ointment, or Vaseline with a Q-tip.
    - Do **NOT** use Neosporin Ointment \*
  - 4. Cover the wound with a band-aid or nonstick gauze pad and paper tape.
  - 5. Repeat wound care once a day for 1 week.

#### POSSIBLE COMPLICATIONS:

# **BLEEDING:**

- 1. Leave the bandage in place.
- 2. Use tightly rolled up gauze or a cloth to apply direct pressure over the bandage for 20 minutes.
- 3. Leave off for 5 minutes and then reapply pressure for an additional 20 minutes, if necessary.
- 4. You can repeat up to 3 times.
- 5. Use additional gauze and tape to maintain pressure once the bleeding has stopped.
- 6. Call the office or go to the nearest emergency room if pressure fails to stop the bleeding.

## PAIN:

1. Post operative pain should slowly get better, beginning the evening after surgery. A sudden or severe increase in pain may indicate a problem. Call the office if this occurs.
